Energy Saving Tips



As gas and electric prices rise, we have compiled a list of 10 things you may be able to do to help reduce your bill slightly.

- Turn off and unplug electrical items when not in use (items on standby can still draw electricity).
- Don't charge phones over night.
- Wash items on lower temperatures and air dry instead of tumble dry if you can.
- Clean washing machine and dish washer filters, this helps them to perform better.
- Use a slow cooker more, they typically use the same amount of electric as a light bulb.
- Draught-proof your windows and doors to keep the heat in.
- Only heat the rooms you are using (turn individual radiators on and off as required).
- Keep doors closed to keep heat in one room.
- Turn your thermostat down, even 1 degree can save an average household £65 per year.
- Turn down your hot water temperature on your combi boiler. Energy provider Octopus says 55 degrees should be hot enough for most situations.
