
Angel Voices

Money Saving Tips - Grocery Shopping



The cost-of-living crisis is being felt in most areas, so we have complied some helpful tips below to assist with reducing your food bill.

Plan your meals for the following week, this will

help reduce waste.

Check your cupboards before you go shopping, often we buy the same food out of habit but may still have enough left from the last shop.

Shop around, a tin of chopped tomatoes may be £1 in the first shop but 25p in the second.

 Don't go shopping when your hungry, you may end up buying items you don't need out of hunger.

Look at price per KG with item such as meat, it can often be better value in the long run to buy a larger pack of mince for example and freeze in portion sized packs rather than buy individual.

If you have school aged children, check if they are eligible for free school meals on the barnsley.gov.uk website and remember all primary children from reception to year 2 will have access to free school meals as part of the government initiative.

If you are struggling, please contact a local foodbank who will be happy to help. Our local area has provision for those who require it.

Dearne Community Arts' Festival

The Dearne Community Arts' Festival was held on 24th September at Astrea Academy Dearne and was the most successful yet, with over 550 people attending. Exhibitions, workshops, demonstrations and performances all featured throughout the day.

Performances on stage were from the Clayton School of Dance, Barnsley Youth Choir East Children's Choir, The Snap Tin Strummers (Ukukele group) and pupils from the school whose group name is 'The Elks'. We could have a go at hot wax painting, glass painting, creative writing, paper engineering, sand art, henna designs, paper flowers and mosaic postcards.

Also on display at the festival was this year's community art project, which challenged local groups and schools to make a Jubilee Quilt to

celebrate the Oueen's Platinum Jubilee. This beautiful work will henceforth be displayed at Thurnscoe Library.

All in all, a great family day out with lots of positive vibes, as one family told the organisers.





How to make a SCARECROW

Step 1

Create a framework for the shape of the body. The framework is the support that will keep your scarecrow upright, this can be made from a range of materials such as spare wood, broom handles, twigs, branches, or even old pallets.

Step 2

Fill the frame to produce a shapely scarecrow, this can be done by using old clothes and filling them with straw, old bottles, hessian sacks or even black bags filled all filled with a material like straw or old rags.

Stan 3

The next step of bringing your scarecrow to life will involve making the head,. For the head we would recommend using a painted pumpkin, an old football, straw filled hessian sack / any other kind of sack or possibly an old plant pot.

Step 4

Add the accessories if you have any that you believe would add to your scarecrow. For example, if you are looking at making a Dracula based scarecrow, you might want to add cut-out bats to enhance the scene.

Step 5

When the time comes, put your scarecrow out for other residents to admire. If you get chance, go and explore some of the other scarecrows that have been created.
